CRIME VICTIMS DESERVE...



- THE RIGHT to receive timely notification of proceedings, offender's custodial status and other major developments in their case.
- THE RIGHT to be present at court proceedings and to provide input to the prosecutor before a plea agreement is finalized.
- → THE RIGHT to be heard at all proceedings that may result in the offender's release.
- → THE RIGHT to restitution.
